OREGON GAMMA NEWS

OREGON GAMMA CAROLYN MUCH REIL WROTE: It is with a heavy heart that we share on April 18, 2021, the Oregon Gamma chapter members voted to relinquish their charter and place the chapter's assets in trust with the Fraternity. Although we are saddened to share this update with you, we are comforted to know chapter members took great care when making this very difficult decision.

Last summer, Oregon Gamma experienced a significant decline in membership after many members of the chapter resigned from Pi Beta Phi as a result of anti-Greek sentiment on campus, fueling on-going concerns about the Fraternity's commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion. The reduction of members led to the difficult decision to close the chapter facility at the end of the fall term. During the 2020-2021 academic year, a core group of members strived to stabilize chapter operations and grow the membership with the support of their **Chapter Support Officer Amara Fanucci Bell**. Although the chapter effectively transitioned their experience after the facility closed, maintaining a chapter experience with fewer members and operating on a scaled leadership model this past spring was difficult. Members did not believe they could meet basic operational obligations and maintain a positive member experience at the same time, and campus interest in Greek life trending downwards indicated that in the near term that would not change.

In the final days of the spring 2021 semester, the Lake Oswego-Dunthorpe Alumnae Club coordinated with **Chapter President Maddy Kaplan** to provide the remaining members with a chapter dinner following the initiation of three new members. This was one of the last opportunities the women had to gather as active collegiate members, and sharing the meal sponsored by the Club was a true demonstration of lifelong commitment and sincere friendship. A chapter farewell event that was planned for Saturday, September 25, 2021, at the chapter facility had to be postponed, due to ongoing COVID restrictions, to summer of 2022.
